2nd Sunday of Lent

St. Thomas Aquinas said that friends share three things: time, possessions and secrets. For example, how do I know if you're my friend? Well, let's say we've been to Mexico together, you've tried my shaky attempts at pasta carbonara, and you know what ridiculous costume I wore in a music video I filmed in my early twenties. We, dear reader, are definitely friends. We've shared time, possessions and secrets.

How does friendship with Jesus develop? The same way. Jesus lives and eats with his disciples. Then he takes Peter, James and John to Mount Tabor and there reveals to them his deepest secret: his glorious, divine Sonship. The majesty of God shines from within his humanity in a way that goes beyond description. God the Father confirms this "secret," saying, **"This is my chosen Son, listen to him"** (Luke 9:35). It's all so precious that **"they fell silent and did not at that time tell anyone."** Do we take time to be alone with Christ, to allow him to mystically share this "secret" with us as his dear friends?

Lenten challenge: This week, identify one time when you experienced an awareness of some specific aspect of Jesus — perhaps on a retreat, at Mass, in prayer or in an act of service. Spend ten minutes consciously re-living that experience in your heart. If you can't recall one, set aside at least two hours this Lent as a mini retreat, either alone in nature or in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament. Focus on him and ask him to share the secrets of his heart with you. He will. Then, as his friend, share the secrets in your heart.

Devotions, *Explained!* Taizé

Taizé, Explained

Taizé originated in France during World War II. It takes its name from the small town just southeast of Paris where Brother Roger Schutz, a Swiss Protestant, founded the community in the hopes of serving both Christian and Jewish refugees of the German-occupied country. In the years following World War II, Christian men from various traditions — Catholic and Protestant — came to live at Taizé and participate in Brother Roger's vision of ecumenism, social justice and peace, eventually forming a community of about 80 brothers from nearly 30 countries.

Today, Taizé continues to be a place of pilgrimage, particularly for young people, who visit the community in the tens of thousands each year.

Taizé has also become well-known for its style of music and prayer, which emphasizes silence, contemplation and stillness. Taizé devotees have carried its music and traditions to Catholic and Christian communities throughout the world.

Rev. Rick Potts, C.Ss.R.

Fr. Rick Potts was born in St. Louis, Missouri, in the Fall of 1961. He is the third of five children born to Marge and Robert Potts, Sr. He was baptized a child of God as an infant and grew in faith guided by devoted parents. He was confirmed in the fullness of the Spirit at his home parish of St. David on the 3rd of November 1972. He attended Fox Elementary, Junior and Senior High School in Arnold, Missouri, where he spent his youth. In the Fall of 1979 he entered the Archdiocesan Seminary of St. Louis. After three years of study, he transferred to the Redemptorist college in Waterford, Wisconsin, where he attained a B.A. in Philosophy in 1985. After completing his novitiate Rick attained his M.Div. from Catholic Theological Union in Chicago, Illinois. In 2004, Rick would earn a Master of Theology from the Institute of Black Catholic Studies at Xavier University, New Orleans, Louisiana.

Rick made his first religious vows to the Redemptorist way of life in the summer of 1986. He was ordained to the priesthood in 1991 at St. Alphonsus "Rock" Church in St. Louis, Missouri. Rick's first assignment was to Holy Name Church in Omaha, Nebraska, where he worked in the parish and with the H.N. Housing Corp. Rick was then assigned to Our Lady of Perpetual Help Parish in Kansas City, Missouri, for three years, when Fr. Maurice J. Nutt asked him to consider transferring to the Rock. Rick then spent 8 years as the associate pastor of St. Alphonsus "Rock" Church in St. Louis, Missouri. In 2002, Rick was installed as the 33rd pastor of "The Rock" Church and served God's people in that position for 3 years. In 2005, Rick accepted an invitation to be one of the founding members of the first Redemptorist foundation in Tennessee, at the parish of The Holy Names of Jesus and Mary in Memphis, where he did parish missions. In 2007 Rick became the editor-in-chief of Liguorian, a magazine published by the Redemptorists at Liguori Publications. In November of 2010 he returned to his beloved St. Alphonsus Church to once again pastor the flock of "The Rock," as the 36th pastor. In 2019 Rick was transferred to Grand Rapids, MI, where he became pastor of St. Alphonsus parish. After the Denver Province decided to turn the parish over to the diocese, Rick was assigned to

St. Gerard parish in Baton Rouge, LA, as associate pastor. He was asked to use his experience of ministering in the Black community to try and grow the parish by evangelizing the local community.

Throughout his life Rick has been heavily involved in working in areas of peace and justice. This has included work in Northern Ireland, work with Pax Christi, an international Catholic peace movement, work with Holy Name Housing Corporation, and being an advocate for community development. Rick is also an avid fine-art nature photographer.

Lenten Obligations

- 1. The days of fast and abstinence are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.
- 2. All other Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence.
- 3. The obligation of fast applies only to Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59.

Fasting in the Catholic tradition means to limit oneself to one full meal and two smaller meals which together are not equal to a full meal, so as to experience hunger.

4. The obligation of abstinence applies to all Catholics who have reached the age of 14.

Abstinence in the Catholic tradition means to abstain from meat.
